



PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, IN 1492, CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS, A MAN OF ITALIAN HERITAGE, MADE HIS FIRST VOYAGE TO AMERICA; AND,
- WHEREAS, THE FIRST COLUMBUS DAY CELEBRATION WAS HELD IN 1792 IN NEW YORK CITY—THE 300TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ITALIAN MAN'S LANDING IN AMERICA; AND,
- WHEREAS, PRESIDENT FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT PROCLAIMED COLUMBUS DAY AS A NATIONAL HOLIDAY, AND TO DATE IT IS THE ONLY DAY ON WHICH ALL PAN-AMERICAN LANDS JOIN IN CELEBRATION; AND,
- WHEREAS, COLUMBUS DAY IS A LEGAL, FEDERAL HOLIDAY THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES AND THIS YEAR WILL BE CELEBRATED ON MONDAY, OCTOBER 8, 2007; AND ITALIAN HERITAGE MONTH WILL BE CELEBRATED THROUGHOUT THE CITY DURING THE ENTIRE MONTH OF OCTOBER. OUR 69TH ANNUAL OBSERVANCE WILL BE AT THE COLUMBUS MONUMENT ON THE SOUTH LAWN OF THE STATE CAPITOL THE SAME DAY.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, T.M. FRANKLIN COWNIE, MAYOR, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 2007, AS:

ITALIAN HERITAGE MONTH

IN HONOR OF ALL ITALIAN-AMERICANS IN THE CITY OF DES MOINES AND ACROSS AMERICA.
